For students entering Grade 9 in September 2011

Big Picture Seminar

The Big Picture Seminar helps students get the most out of their stay in high school. It provides students with a broader vision of the possibilities and importance of these years in preparing them for the future: their professional life, marriage and family life. The program touches on subjects such as studies, extra-curricular activities, job, career, and university planning, character formation, and leadership.

For students entering Grade 10 in September 2011

Cedarcrest Volunteer Camp

Participants at this work camp volunteer their time by doing repairs and gardening work at a conference centre near Toronto, and engage in sports and other outdoor activities. The week also includes sessions on leadership and presentations by speakers on various cultural subjects such as film appreciation and history.

Dates: August 22 - September 1
Cost: \$150



For students entering Grade 11 in September 2011

Manitoba Social Project

This project takes place in Berens River, Manitoba, a Native reserve on the east side of Lake Winnipeg only accessible by bush plane or ferry. The participants do manual labour at the local Roman Catholic church, and also tutor the local youth in English, Math, and other subjects. The project also includes an excursion day onto islands in Lake Winnipeg.

Dates: June 27 - July 4
July 21 - 31
Cost: \$200 + airfare to Winnipeg
